
### **#Live Lent**

### Ask Auntie Lauraine

Our resident theological agony aunt answers your questions.

"Why did God create others planets if there's no life on them? What was the point?" - Pippa Beazley-Long

Many people, Christian or otherwise, struggle with the notion that the earth is the only inhabited planet in this enormous universe. In short, is there life on other planets? In my experience, this seems to be the major underlying reason why people think that there must be other life 'out there'. However, our thinking should be based on what God said He did (the Bible), and not what we think He would, should or might have done.

Since God is the one who made the universe, it can scarcely be 'big' to Him. We struggle with its vastness because our comprehension is limited to the created time/space dimensions within which we exist and it's mind-bending to try to comprehend anything beyond our dimensional existence. But God isn't bound by time and space (which He created).

It should be remembered that expressions like "the heavens and earth" (Genesis 1:1) are a figure of speech. Similarly, biblical Hebrew has no word for 'the universe', so instead it uses the term "the heavens and the earth". It is clear that New Testament passages like Romans 8:18–22 and Hebrews 11:3 are pointing back to the Genesis ("heavens and earth") creation, and thus, everything that God made and when time as we know it began.

Be 'awe' inspired - Psalm 19:1 tells us a major reason that the universe is so vast: 'The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament shows His handiwork.' There are many similar passages in Scripture. They help us understand who God is and how powerful He is. It reminds us that the more we discover about this incredible universe, the more we should be in awe of the One who made it all. In short rather than looking up and wondering 'I wonder what else is out there?' and imaginary aliens we've never seen. We should instead be considering the very One that made it all.

### And now for something a little lighter!

I am the very model of effective social distancing!
I listen to the experts on the topic of resistance-ing;
I know that brunch and yoga class aren't nearly as imperative
As doing what I can to change the nation's viral narrative.

I'm very well acquainted, too, with living solitarily
And confident that everyone can do it temporarily:
Go take a walk, or ride a bike, or dig into an unread book;
Avoid the bars and restaurants and carry out, or learn to cook.

There's lots of stuff to watch online while keeping safe from sinus ills

(In this case, it's far better to enjoy your Netflix MINUS chills)! Adopt a pet, compose a ballad, write some earnest doggerel, And help demolish Trump before our next event inaugural.

Pandemics are alarming, but they aren't insurmountable
If everybody pitches in to hold ourselves accountable.
In short, please do your part to practice prudent co-existence-ing,

### JUST A THOUGHT!

The old adage about March tells us it is "in like a lamb, out like a lion" or vice versa, and certainly it does seem to be a month which goes to the extremes weatherwise - we can expect anything from snow to summer sunshine.



March is a lovely month, whatever the weather we can always be sure of a good show of spring flowers; the 20th marks the end of winter; this year we have Mothering Sunday on the 21st; on the 28th we put the clocks forward - my diary is headed "Summer Time Begins", and this really seems to set the seal on what to me, is probably the best thing of all - the joy of longer hours of day light.

Light is such an imortant element in our lives - right at the beginning, God said "Let there be light" - light is essential for life - Jesus said [John 8] "I am the light of the world - he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life". God showed Himself to MOses in the form of light "The angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire," and again He led the Israelites by night "in a pillar of fire to give them light". In Psalm 119 we read "Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

The opposite of light - 'darkness' is seen in the Bible as synonymous with sin. John tells us "This is the judgement that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil."

We are encouraged to be a light to others "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father . . ."

Do enjoy the light hours as they increase - make the most of them - don't let them be soiled by sin - then maybe next winter you will have a little store of light to guide you through the dark days.
