
how we view ourselves, family, friends and our world, and our responses to

Keeping hope alive: 'education for life'

Eighteen-year-old Nadia Kabula's story is not an extraordinary one. For many people in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), life is a struggle.
Following ten years of conflict, malnourishment and preventable diseases still claim thousands of lives each week. Christian Aid partner organisations are helping to rebuild lives and livelihoods in some of the DRC's most vulnerable communities.

After the greatest challenge of Nadia's life, Christian Aid partner Humanité Nouvelle was there to help her focus on the future and the hope of a better life.

Nadia's father died suddenly two-and-ahalf years ago. Her grieving mother, Brigitte, struggled to provide for her six children. Even though Brigitte works gruelling 48-hour shifts, some weeks her transport costs total almost as much as her weekly salary. Christian Aid/Heidi Bradner

Nadia was profoundly affected by the death of her father, whom she adored. And his death had immediate practical implications. There was no money to pay for her schooling, so she had to drop out and care for her younger siblings while their mother worked.

Families like Nadia's often hear about Humanité Nouvelle's tailoring course through their local church. The course helps poor girls to develop skills to support themselves and their families. Nadia explains why girls in similar situations turn to sex work: 'They need to pursue their education and, with a lack of means, get desperate.'

It would have been easy for Nadia to despair. But instead Humanité Nouvelle 'have given me education for life', she says. She completed the course and now helps to teach the new intake of girls.

Nadia still takes care of her siblings, as well as being a mentor at Humanité
Nouvelle. Her mother describes her as 'a blessing... [without her] things would be very hard'. And it's not just her family who speak so positively of her – her pastor also talks about the inspiring influence of her gospel singing.

Nadia is confident that she can earn a good living from sewing and she is clear about her priorities: 'If God helps me... I will do all I can to take care of my siblings and my mother.'

As collectors we can be inspired by Nadia. Even in difficult circumstances she is planting seeds of hope around her.

And Nadia's mother has a message for us: 'You volunteers should not be discouraged when you're turned away from houses. You should carry on because without that money it would be very difficult for... children from destitute backgrounds to get training, get a job and secure their future.'

Your time and money are more valuable than you know. You could give a chance of a brighter future to another young person like Nadia, and support them to bring hope to the people around them.

The ripple effect of collecting at Christian Aid Week is immense – by taking part you are working alongside people like Nadia to help change the world. In the DRC:

- £5/€6.50 could buy six yards of material, from which a three-piece woman's outfit can be made
- £10/€13 could provide a girl with enough material to complete a 12-month tailoring course
- £40/€51 could pay the monthly salary of a tailoring instructor.



But one of them lost interest and then there were five.








Five little Christians, pulling for heaven's shore, One stopped to take a rest and then there were four.



16. BERYL'S NEWS MARCH 2009 by email

"The heat is intolerable; every day the thermometer registers over 40; yesterday and Sunday 45. The rain still hasn't arrived and it is now getting to the end of the "wet" season. Already the emergency services are ferrying water to the Chaco communities. A visit to the U.K. is still a thought and not a reality, so please don't raise your hopes too much. There are a lot of disturbing things going on in the Chaco due to a fanatical so-called Pentecostal group, and two of the Indian pastors have thrown in their lot with them, despite receiving a monthly salary from the diocese. The two concerned have become very aggressive and poor Andres Rodriguez "holding the fort" until the appointment of the new bishop in a month or two is having a shattering time. Robert Fernandez from La Patria was not present when Andres went to see him as he was in another community which has linked up with the bizarre group. The President of Paraguay wants to meet with all the Pentecostal church leaders in Asuncion to try to find out what's really going on as some people have died and violence has broken out in other places. This group insists that we are in the Last Days and therefore we have to spend all the time in prayer and praise. Thus the children don't have to go to school. They hand out suits and ties to all the young men, saying they must dress "properly" if they are sons of God. Casting out demons is their thing and all the young men think that they have this "gift" which is extremely dangerous. Nothing seems to have changed positively medical-wise as the same corrupt people are still employed and all the



Indian health promoters seem even less likely to ever receive a government salary.

Liberato, one of my helpers remains blind but says at times he can see light, and people like shadows, so maybe some improvement is on the way. Without his input at Sombrero Piri I have a lot more work than before. Norma is great but at present very disheartened as the leader of her community has nominated his sister-in-law as the health promoter, who will receive official Liberato's salary. This lady is untrained and not a very nice person at all and yet the health authorities seem to have accepted her. I pray that Liberato will soon see again before he is written off."

The need to supply medical care and the calling to the spiritual welfare of the residents of the Chaco is totally demanding. The choice for Beryl, is between the punishing requirements of the Chaco and the needs of its impoverished people, or, to take the opportunity to come home to meet up with her many supporters, report, and also get some much-merited rest. The good points are that Beryl has taken up binge-drinking- of water! As a result her leg is a lot less painful, the colour back to normal, and the lump disappeared.

Most recently, we have been contacted by a nurse enquiring about working with Beryl at the clinic. In today's jaded terminology she "ticks all the right boxes", including dog-walking! She has been given much information and advice, but as she puts it, "if God wants me to go, he will make the path plain". Please pray for Beryl and all the situations she experiences in her day to day life in the Chaco.

THE BISHOP OF ROCHESTER STANDS DOWN: Dr Michael Nazir-Ali, the Church's first non-white diocesan bishop, has announced he will retire in September. He received death threats last year after saying that some areas of the UK become no-go areas for non-Muslims because of Islamic extremism. The bishop, who turns 60 in August, wants to work with a number of church leaders after he retires. He said: "We thank God for his blessings and for friends we have made in the diocese in the past 15 years. I am so grateful to God for the friendship and loyalty of those around us and ask for people's prayers as we take this step of faith 'not knowing where we are going'. "The Archbishop of Canterbury said his clarity of mind and expression had made him a really valuable colleague. His last service will be held at Rochester Cathedral on the 12th September. We offer thanks and good wishes.

AGGRESSION BRINGS AGGRESSION via Colin Jenner email. This article in the March-April edition of our Magazine astonished, appalled and saddened me. The first line sets the tone:- "Allah or Jesus Christ", the former is just one of many names given to God the Father, so for Christians there should be no conflict. Can you dispute "Allah akbar" (God is great)? Ignorance of the Koran as shown both by the Imam and author


is shocking but seemingly typical of the radical genre unfortunately. Jesus is frequently respectfully mentioned in that book and called The Messiah. Also it says 'The People of the

Book' (Christians and Jews) are to be respected and not interfered with. Consider the following quotation: Surah 5: 47-48 "Let the people of the Gospel judge by that which Allah hath revealed therein. Whoso judgeth not by that which Allah revealed are evil-livers. And unto thee have We revealed the Scripture with the truth, confirming whatever Scripture was before it, and a watcher over it. So judge between them by that which has come unto thee. For each We have appointed a divine law and a traced-out way. Had Allah willed He could have made you one community. But He may try you by that which He hath given you (He hath made you as you are). So vie one with another in good works. Unto Allah ye will all return, and He will then inform you of wherein ye may differ." Unfortunately, some have chosen to interpret other passages to mean that they should adopt an aggressive attitude. Surely God is able to judge an individual and to chastise them without the intervention of such human fanatics. The likes of Pogroms, Inquisitions and Conquistadores and even Crusaders, (before which, many Muslims and Christians lived in harmony together) remind us of shameful episodes in Christendom's past. Let us show understanding to those who sincerely follow the Muslim path and demonstrate (as Christ did with the Samaritan) that love is far more potent than belligerence. Our Lord said 'Now ye know in part but then all will be revealed to you', also 'In My house there are many mansions'. This latter, to me, hints at divers approaches to heaven deliberately made so that we might have a spur to continue to please God by searching for the right path; the real truth only to be revealed once we are with Him. Al-Islam means 'The Surrender' - i.e. Man's complete surrender to God's will and purpose, which we should all strive to do! Muslims take a far harder stand against idols than is shown by some of our Christian brethren. Remember, 'The Cross' is a Christian symbol to remind us of Christ's love

and His sacrifice for our sins on the Cross: it should never be regarded as a talisman.
