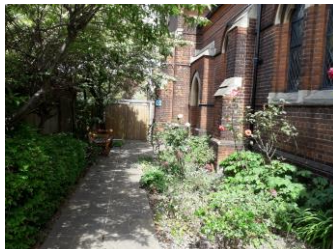

## Ministry @Home



**These resources are to help equip & enable worship together as "family". They are intentionally intergenerational to allow space, conversation, activity & response together as the family of God. We encourage all ages to be participative & open, being responsive to God and each other.**

### Gather.....

- As you gather find a place that is comfortable and have the resources ready for the activities, prayer or response times ready.
- Choose 3 members to light the 3 candles (engage all ages)

#### Opening words of praise with lighting of 3 candles -

I will light a light  
in the name of the Maker,  
who lit the world  
and gave everything life.

I will light a light  
in the name of the Son,

and stretched out his hand to me.

**Reflection time:** In pairs, using soft wool or string set yourselves as in the picture below. Using a stop-watch, time how quickly you can separate from your partner with the string/wool still attached to your hands and not using any scissors!! To succeed you must be standing by your partner separated but with the string/wool not broken. Keep trying with different partners to see who can separate the fastest. Once you've succeeded in your challenge share in your gathering the following questions:

1. Whilst tied to your partner did you feel constrained? not able to move freely?
2. Did you need to work together to succeed in the challenge?

Through Jesus dying on the cross at Easter, He broke the barrier of sin between God and us. Jesus restored our relationship with God and became the person who filled the gap. We can sometimes be bound by our sin, what we have said or done; or what we have not said or done – this can separate us from God. We need to work at being Dead to Sin (turning away from that sin) and being Alive to God and His way for us.

## Interactive Learning.....

### Scavenger Hunt

**Resources:** Play-doh, wire hanger, hammer, bag of sweets, ruler, small wrapped gift.

**Preparation:** Before your act of worship begins, hide the props throughout your gathering space

#### The nominated Clue Master will:

Give each clue and challenge those who you gather with to find the items:

1. This is something we use to form objects. It's very soft and fun to use. **(Play-doh)**
2. We use this at home to keep our clothes organised. It has a weird shape. **(Wire hanger)**
3. Now look for a tool that's handy for hanging pictures on the wall or building something out of wood. It's long and can be a little heavy. **(Hammer)**
4. This is something that can give us cavities if we eat too many. It's small and has a lot of pieces. **(Bag of sweets)**
5. We use this next item to measure something's length. It's skinny and light. **(Ruler)**
6. Lastly, look for an item you like to get on a special holiday. It's small and pretty. **(Gift)**

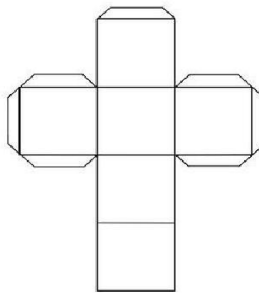
**Once all the items have been found** and are placed in front of everyone, the clue master is to hold up each item as you explain the eternal life message:

1. **Play-doh:** "God wants to 'mold' us into who He created us to be."
2. **Wire hanger:** "The problem is, we become 'bent' on sin and want to do what we want - have our own way."
3. **Hammer:** "And it seems easier to be able to 'work' for our own eternal life by doing a few good things here and there."
4. **Bag of sweets:** "But Jesus is the only 'good' person who ever lived on earth because He's the only person who has never sinned."
5. **Ruler:** So, we can't follow our own 'rules' if we're following Jesus. We have to acknowledge God in our lives and God being in control.
6. **Gift:** "But the good news of the Gospel is that God gives us the 'gift' of eternal life because Jesus died for our sins. We can receive the gift of salvation when we believe in Jesus and turn away from our sins."

### Alive To God – Advert

**Resources:** A recording device either voice or video

Within your gathering explain a radio/TV station has chosen them to record a 30-second commercial. The product you are selling is: the message in Matthew 6:11. You may need to mind map your concept together before your final recording. **HAVE FUN** sharing about what this verse means to you.

2. **What do you think are the "key" words from the bible readings?**
3. **How can we celebrate during this coming week to show we are Alive to God?**

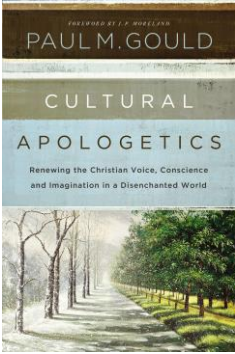

This week's book suggestions come from The 2020 Christian book awards.

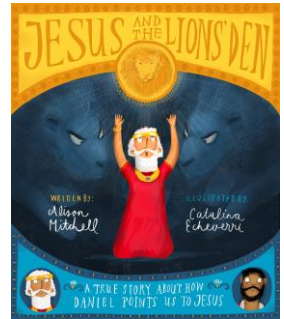


### Award of Merit – Cultural Apologetics by Paul M. Gould

This is an extraordinary and original book, quite unlike anything I've ever read on the subject. Well written. Practical. Insightful. Stimulating. Challenging. Any Christian, church, or Christian organization wanting to do serious evangelism in the 21st century should read this book.

### Youth & Children – Jesus And The Lion's Den by Alison Mitchell

I really appreciated how the book connected the dots from the story and life of Daniel to the story and life of Jesus. I wish there were more books that would take Old Testament stories and messages and point kids to their fulfilment in Christ. The story line was easy to follow, and I enjoyed how the graphics draw kids in to look for Jesus moments.



### Christian Living – The Common Rule by Justin Whitmel Earley

This book is an excellent blend of theological and practical insight. It describes problems unique to our time in a way that's easily relatable, in part because Earley makes good use of personal anecdotes rather than merely citing sociological data. The strength of the book is how well he connects these common problems to simple, usable practices of resistance.

# Ann's simple recipes for everyone

St Paul's resident culinary queen Ann Easter shares some of her recipes with you.

## Rhubarb Crumble Cake

### Ingredients

10oz / 300g Flour  
5 oz / 150g Butter  
2oz / 60g White sugar  
2 Eggs  
2 tbs Milk  
2 large stick Rhubarb  
250ml Orange Juice  
1oz / 30g Brown Sugar



### Instructions

Chop the rhubarb into pieces and put it in a saucepan along with the orange juice. Cook on a low heat until the rhubarb is soft but not mushy. When cooked, drain and leave to cool.

Into a large mixing bowl place 8oz / 220g of the flour, 4oz / 120g of the butter, White sugar, eggs and milk. Mix the ingredients together.

Now add half of the rhubarb and mix.

Pour the batter into a greased 7" / 18cm cake tin and prepare the crumble topping

To make the crumble topping, mix the remaining flour and butter along with the brown sugar. When a crumble consistency has been achieved stir in the remaining rhubarb spoon by spoon making sure that the crumble doesn't become too wet.

Spread the crumble over the cake mix.

Bake at gas mark 4 / 160c for 50mins. Check with a skewer that the cake is cooked.

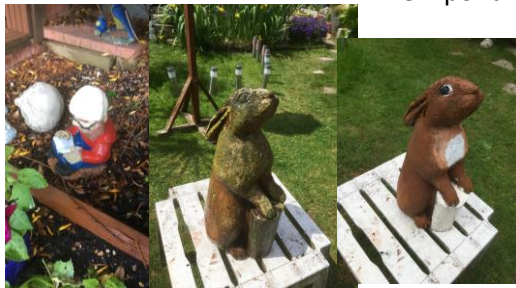

## Blast from the Past

From "St Pauls Parish News March 1972"

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### FROM THE VICAR

My dear Friends,

#### The Christian Mind

War - Poverty - Racial Violence - Student Protest - Industrial Unrest. Contemporary world upheaval has reached alarming proportions. None of us dares suggest there is an easy solution to any of the problems. Our leaders do not know which way to turn. Christians appear by their silence to be equally baffled. Thus, the false impression is given that Christianity has nothing of direct importance to say to the modern world. I have just been re-reading Harry Blamires' well-informed and challenging book, "The Christian Mind" (SPCK), in which he submits that, because we so often fail to be explicit on matters of current import, the world does not know there is a Christian mind - "we have become afraid of our convictions", and forgotten that Christianity is not a matter of opinion, but a matter of fact. Our task at St. Paul's must be to equip Christians in every part of their thinking to distinguish between right and wrong, between good and evil, and, wherever necessary, with grace and clarity to speak out.

I must pay tribute to Mr. Norman Weeks and Mr. Edmund Wheble on their retirement as Church Wardens at the recent Annual Meeting. As a Church, we would like to assure them of our very real gratitude for all that they have done over many years, as we wish them God's continuing blessing in their life and witness among us.
