Welcome, brothers and sisters to the fourteenth edition of "Church at Home".

As you probably know the government has announced we can open again for worship. This is wonderful news of course, but comes with a caveat.

We are being asked to put in place a number of measures and there is a lot we can't do including, singing, praying in groups, the peace, meeting before or after the service, children's groups, have toys out, play instruments, use flags or receive wine at communion.

The advice is to go slow and we will be doing that at St Paul's. To begin with we will re instate the Wednesday communion at 9:30am and the 9am Communion on Sundays. You are welcome to attend but equally can continue worship at home in the ways you have been doing during this crisis. On the next page is an idea of what to expect when you come to a service until restrictions are lifted further.

I would like to thank Colin who has been processing the huge amount of information and putting in place a lot of the practical measures and giving advice on what is feasible for the present time.

Follow the guidance, encourage each other, pray and stay safe.

Church noticeboard

Acting on Advice from the Church of England this is what to expect when you come to Church.

It is advisable for you wear a covering over your nose and mouth. Before entering the church, your temperature will be taken remotely by a steward and unfortunately, if it is higher than the government recommendation, you and any members of your household won't be able to attend the service. We understand that this may be upsetting, but please help our stewards to keep you and the church family safe.

We are providing sanitizing gel and this must be applied on entering and leaving the church.

Please do not congregate at the entrance or in church, but move to your seats as directed.

Seating will be distanced, but of course, you may sit with other members of your household or anyone you have formed a bubble with.

Toilet facilities will be available.

Communion will be given in one kind only. You will be asked to keep a one metre distance whilst queuing and you will be required to use sanitising gel before receiving communion.

Unfortunately, at the end of the service it will not be possible to socialise in the church.

Please help our stewards, who have volunteered, to ensure that we can hold the service in safety and fellowship to the Glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Create a Welcome Banner for your home/church – this could be placed on an outside wall if weather proofed or in a window. Using the letters of “WELCOME” create short sentences that illustrate the meaning and describe how people would be welcomed.

Whilst creating chat about the following questions & share stories....

- **Have you ever felt your faith being tested when things aren't going too well?**
- **Have you ever questioned God or doubted your trust and faith in God?**
- **I wonder if we could be more welcoming and more loving.....**
- **Share would you rather be welcoming or be welcomed & why...**

The meaning of the word Welcome is to be pleased about, encourage or to support something and if someone is welcome, you are pleased when they visit you. Sometimes it is easy to be pleased when we see someone and other times we are less keen! How far are we prepared to go to be pleased, or support, or encourage when we are with people? At this current time we may be less pleased to be with the people who we've had to be very close too – it's not always easy to be “welcoming” when we are wishing we'd rather be with someone else or be somewhere else.

Our bible story of Abraham and Isaac is a powerful story but also can be a disturbing story. Abraham had already left his family, his country to follow where God had called him to be.

Abraham is open and willing to respond to both God and his son Isaac, the dilemma (decision) for Abraham at this stage is having to choose between God and his son. They journey together for 3 days to get to the place where God called them to be – put yourself in their shoes:

How would you feel as Isaac – remember he was obeying his father Abraham and not sure of what was happening.

How would you feel as Abraham – Abraham was known for his faith & trust in God but is this a step too far?

Faith is confident that God is always good, fair, just and loving no matter what He does or asks us to do. As we follow Abraham's example of living a life which is faithful and following God's requests even when it's difficult – this may also mean welcoming people whom we may find difficult.

Game

Blow up a balloon and play a game of “No Let Down.” As you sit or stand in a circle and toss the balloon into the people you are gathered with say: “Don't let the balloon fall to the floor. You may only bat at the balloon with your hands. No one is allowed to catch it”. If the balloon falls, ask/share one of the questions in the think bubble.

Take a Trip

Journey to a view point or the beach - get up while it's still dark. Grab some blankets and a thermos of hot chocolate, and find a place with a good place to watch the sunrise. While you're sitting in the predawn darkness, ask: “What would happen if the sun stopped rising?” Wait for the sunrise, then ask: “Why do you suppose God is faithful to always keep the sun shining in our lives?” Chat about God being faithful to Abraham or how to be more welcoming as we welcome the sunrise every day.

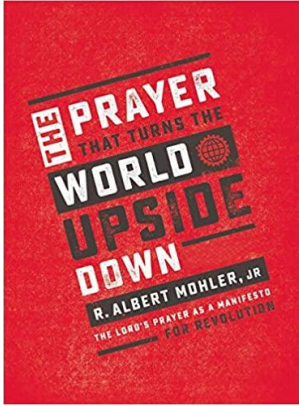

The Prayer That Turns The World Upside Down by R. Albert Mohler Jr

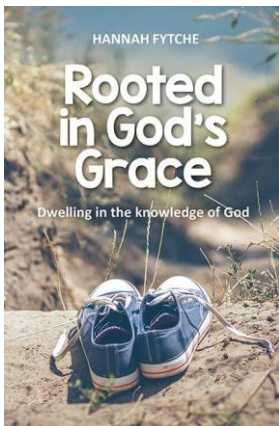
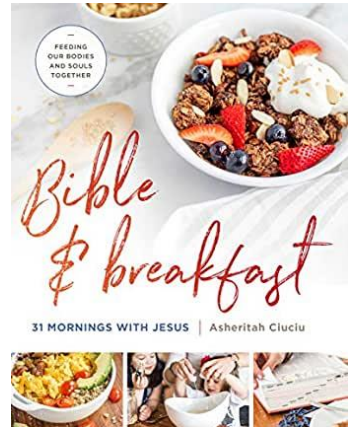

That's an easy one, well the first part is anyway:

Philippians 4:13 (NRSVA)

Why? I'll give you the very short version here. I'm working on a longer one which I will ask Colin to put on the website in due course.

Anyway, some of you may remember when I went literally from a healthy young mum one day (my children were 1 and 3) to being hospitalised the next and being told I had a brain tumour and not long to live. That was way back in the days of Robin Balch (Robin the Rev).

It was a shock to us all, it's still hard to believe all these years later! I never did have the operation that only had a 50/50 survival rate and the significant possibility of complete paralysis of my right side even if I did.

What I did have was prayer. From Robin the Rev to start with continued by his wife Eileen to this day and many others from St Paul's past and present.

In those first few months of trying to understand all that was going on I was given that verse from Philippians loads of times, on cards, magnets, bookmarks, through prayer and of course by reading my bible. God was indeed telling me something, how could I not hold on to those words.

I went from being told at best I would never be able to learn anything again to gaining a 2:1 Honours degree in Theology, getting a PGCE in Education and training to become a Reader in the same year, becoming Head of Upper School with 400 students in my care and a budget of a few million to juggle with - no bad for someone who was supposed to be going senile due to a tumour.

I believe that this verse is for all of us. If God is with us who can be against us?

13 I can do all things through him who strengthens me.

Ann's simple recipes for everyone

St Paul's resident culinary queen Ann Easter shares some of her recipes with you.

Banana Loaf

Ingredients

8oz / 220g Self raising flour
4oz / 120g Butter
4oz / 120g Brown sugar
2 Eggs
2 Soft bananas
1oz / 60g Icing sugar



Instructions

Sift the flour into a large mixing bowl.

Mash the bananas and add to the flour.

Add the sugar, eggs and butter and mix to a smooth batter.

Place the mix into a greased 2lb / 1kg loaf tin.

Bake at gas mark 4 / 160c for 50 minutes.

Check with a skewer that the cake is cooked.

When the cake has cooled turn out and sift icing sugar over the top.

Chocoholic?

and drizzle melted chocolate on
the finished cake.

After months of waiting, we now have a new Communion Table for our re-ordered Chancel. You are not likely to see another table like this, (unless it is copied in years to come), it is special to St. Paul's.

Keith McGill had the idea and drew an artist's impression. The PCC approved and someone suggested using the discarded front pews. The necessary permission was obtained from Diocese. A friend, Bob Coltart was approached, and after joining us at our Family Communion Service he agreed to put his skill into following Keith's drawing.

Then started many hours of dedicated work, the road was littered with boulders - the pews had to be hand planed because nobody would risk putting second-hand wood on a machine - the hard winter stopped production for a bit, because Bob was working in his unheated garage - some materials had to be purchased and these were almost unobtainable and had to be awaited with much patience.

Each time Bob put an estimated date on the completion of the table something went wrong to delay that date - even close to the end of the work, when we hoped to have it for the Confirmation Service, there was a slip with a chisel that resulted in a badly damaged finger for Bob - but at last, on 5th July, Derrick Blacker and Ron Handy were able to go and collect St. Paul's Communion Table.

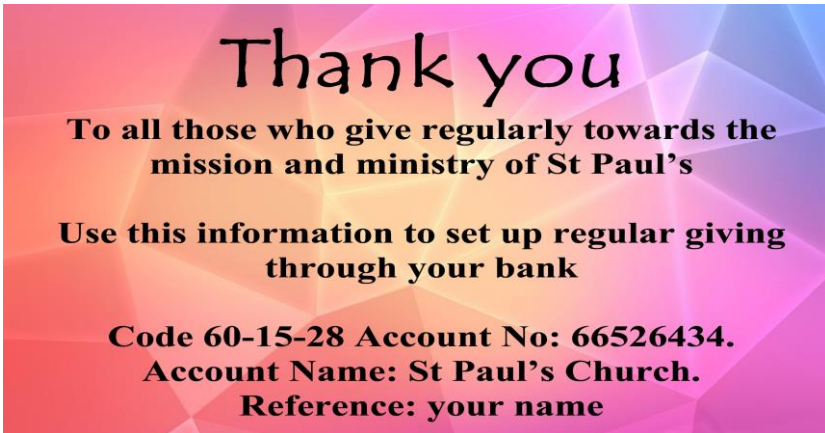
