Acting on Advice from the Church of England this is what to expect when you come to Church.

It is advisable for you wear a covering over your nose and mouth.

Before entering the church, your temperature will be taken remotely by a steward and unfortunately, if it is higher than the government recommendation, you and any members of your household won't be able to attend the service. We understand that this may be upsetting, but please help our stewards to keep you and the church family safe.

We are providing sanitizing gel and this must be applied on entering and leaving the church.

Please do not congregate at the entrance or in church, but move to your seats as directed.

Seating will be distanced, but of course, you may sit with other members of your household or anyone you have formed a bubble with.

Communion will be given in one kind only. You will be asked to keep a one metre distance whilst queuing and you will be required to use sanitising gel before receiving communion.

Unfortunately, at the end of the service it will not be possible to socialise in the church.

Please help our stewards, who have volunteered, to ensure that we can hold the service in safety and fellowship to the Glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Science Experiment

Separating cork from sand!! Here's what you'll need:

- · chopped pieces of cork
- sand
- a paper plate
- one transparent container with water
- one container without water
- a spoon

What to do:

Mix the cork and sand together on a paper plate, make sure they are mixed well so it's hard to tell the difference between the sand and the cork. Then, place them both into the bowl/container with water. The cork will float, but the sand will sink. Use a spoon to remove the cork. You can also use a coffee filter to strain the sand from the water if you wish. As one of you is removing the cork explain, just like we separated the cork from the sand, one day God will separate those who follow Him from those who do not. Remember, a parable is a story that Jesus taught in order to help his followers understand important truths.

Jesus Speaks in Parables

Jesus told parables to people, he was never without a story to share with those who he was gathered with. Jesus also spoke to crowds of people but when he was alone with his disciples he explained everything in this story. The word of God is alive, it is a relationship, think and share with those who you are gathered, the times when you *can* and *do* read and act upon the stories of Jesus and the word of God?

When we are in a personal relationship with God, he changes us, makes us more loving and encourages us to live in his ways. We need to respond and a way of responding is to take action (A good choice). As a way of taking action write down something you can do as an induvial or as a gathering that seals/confirms you responding to Jesus within the coming week. When the word of God is planted in our hearts good fruit will grow.

You could make a collage from magazine cuttings then place your actions on the collage.



Walking by the wheat

Go for a prayer walk in the countryside if you are able. You may be live near wheat fields; if so walk around the edge, looking at the wheat, remember being part of God's creation. Alternatively walk around your neighbourhood noticing God's creation, remember **YOU** are part of God's creation and plan a "good" action.

<u>Mission</u>

Update from our mission partner, Beryl Baker



Beryl is a nurse who works in Paraguay. She has been on the mission field for over 50 years and we have supported her as a mission partner throughout that time.

Paraguay is blessed with a Christian President and Minister of Health, both with common sense who from the beginning of the pandemic immediately imposed strict precautions to protect everyone. Up to this day only 20 people have died.

2 Peter 3.9 The Lord is not slow in fulfilling his promise. Jesus will return and the things that are happening are a sure sign that God wants everyone to be aware they must turn back to Him before it is too late.

Please remember in your prayers the desperate need for rain in the Chaco where so many people and grass eating animals are without water. Wild and domestic lack food too. For continued protection against Covid 19 and praise that so far, the Chaco is clear of positive cases.

The health promoters. Lidia at La Patria. Narcisa at Estribo and Cirilo. Maria Teresa at Larrosa Cue. Norma at her home at the side of the Transchaco road. Arsenio and Lino at Makthlawaiya. Daniel Fernandez at 8 d.enero which is on the road to La Patria. Only 2 receive a government salary, a grave injustice.

Cirilo Benitez needs special prayer as he has a badly infected foot which is taking a long time to heal because of his diabetes. He is 67 and serving the people at Estribo well inspite of being done out of his small pension by someone forging his signature. This month this situation should be put right.DV.

A 38 year old lady that I took to town from the ranch died at her humble home at Limpio a suburb of Asuncion leaving her tractor driver partner. A 10 year old son and a two year old daughter. The son is with his paternal grandparents while Noemi the 2 year

old stays at the ranch with an indigenous family with whom she is extremely happy and well cared for. Her father continues with his work but does not live in the same location as his little daughter.

Please pray for the health situation at Rio Verde where the government health post has been dismantled with no one being informed.

Trips to the La Patria indigenous communities continue and over the past three weeks I have attended 204 patients all of which had nothing too seriously wrong. The Anglican pastors at these places are very helpful.

The need for a new means of transport is now urgent as the present Toyota is having constant problems and flat tyres; the insurance has now expired.

Jordy is now supporting his mother, Graciela as she has no income due to the school not opening. 6-year-old Jonathan is pretty bored by having to stay in most of the time and the TV burnt out during a power cut and he only can use his father's Smart phone to continue with his On Line education.

Better and more frequent conversations with Rhett are a must. He is well and in Asuncion.He is now 80. After the 15th of this month when the quarantine rules are more relaxed, he hopes to come to his ranch if his wife Mari will drive him to the Chaco. He hasn't been there for a year.

One side of the Transchaco highway is rapidly advancing and the asphalt from Rio Verde onwards is almost at the entrance to the ranch. Praise the Lord for answered prayers in that the two lovely big trees at the ranch gate will not be cut down. Coping with the clouds of lime cement impregnated dust is a challenge. Very high winds sweeping this dust into the clinic and house makes everything filthy and some of the cats. dogs and horses have infected eyes from the dust


Neri Sosa. Pastor Juan Sosa's son has again broken his leg. It has been pinned and he and his father are now back at Makthlawaiya. Urgent prayer is needed for them along with the diocesan office worker who drove them back to the Chaco from the indigenous people's hospital at Limpio where Neri was in a non-fumigated room after a positive Covid 19 patient had been using it. We pray that they have not contracted the virus.

The obligatory use of face masks is now being more strictly enforced with huge fines for people who will not conform with quarantine rules.

To finish as I started. Trust and obey as there is no other way to be happy in Jesu**\$b**ut to trust and obey. Thank you for your prayers. May the Lord bless you and protect you. Lots of love, **Beryl**.


This week's book suggestions come from beautifulchristianlife.com



None Greater by Matthew Barrett

Ask Lauraíne

Our resident theological thinker answers your questions.

This week's Questions is: Matthew 12:31-32 says blasphemy against the Spirit is unforgivable. How do I know if I have done this?

What is the unpardonable sin? Jesus Himself said in Matthew 12:31, "And so I tell you, every kind of sin and slander can be forgiven, but blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven." If a person truly listens to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and asks for pardon and forgiveness that person is not guilty of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit.

Is there a sin that cannot be forgiven? Yes, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is any sin that a person clings to by continually resisting the convicting power of the Holy Spirit. Keep in mind that there is not one specific sin that is unforgivable, such as lying, stealing or murder, but rather a perpetual hardening of the heart and wilfully sinning against God and man (1 Timothy 4:2; Titus 1:15). In Acts 7:51, Stephen says the following to the Pharisees, "You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers did, so do you". In a nutshell, the unpardonable sin is any sin that a person doesn't want to give up, confess, or even ask forgiveness for and additionally doesn't want to hear any more about it from the Holy Spirit.

Any sin mankind wants pardon for is forgivable. However, if we turn our backs on the voice of the Holy Spirit we begin to silence His convictions and eventually we cannot hear His convicting power. This effectively blocks the working of God in our lives because we have reached a point where we are unable to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

If we look at the context of Matthew 12, we see that Christ used the power of the Holy Spirit to heal a demon-possessed man who was deaf and mute. Amazed onlookers began to suspect He was the promised Messiah (Matthew 12:22), so religious leaders tried to quell the crowd's growing excitement. They claimed the Lord was Satah's fellow worker, who had used the Devil's power to accomplish this miracle. Christ refuted their statement and in Matthew 12:32 said,

"Whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven." Jesus' comments addressed a very specific situation unique to His time. Though the Pharisees had themselves seen the Lord heal many people through the Spirit, they attributed the miraculous work to Satan. Jesus declared that this sin—claiming that God's Holy Spirit was the unclean spirit of the Devil—was unforgivable.

The sin was blasphemy, done deliberately and without repentance, by knowledgeable religious people, despite irrefutable evidence to the contrary.

Consider this illustration of the unpardonable sin. Imagine you are tired of the Holy Spirit convicting you of a particular pet sin. You want to completely remove His promptings even though the voice is warning you of danger and lovingly trying to show you the right path. So what do you do? You begin building a theoretical brick wall to block your conviction. Each brick in the wall represents a singular time you reject the conviction of the Holy Spirit. As you continue to reject the Holy Spirit, the "voice" you hear gets softer and softer. You become more and more confident in your current pathway of life. Eventually, as you lay more and more bricks down you cannot hear the Holy Spirit anymore, thus effectively cutting off your way of repentance and therefore salvation.

The good news is this—if a person still desires forgiveness and confesses their sins, those sins will be forgiven and blotted out. As long as you are under conviction, which is the Holy Spirit's job (John 16:8) and you want to be forgiven you are not guilty of the unpardonable sin. Numerous New Testament verses assure us that no iniquity committed today is beyond the scope of divine forgiveness. So if guilt threatens to overwhelm you, read Romans 8:1 with gratitude.

Let us also pace ourselves for the long term, so that we can see true and lasting change throughout our nations. Together we can make Jesus known.

Ann's simple recipes for everyone

St Paul's resident culinary queen Ann Easter shares some of her recipes with you.

Rock Drop Cakes

Ingredients 8oz/225g Self raising flour 4oz/120g Brown sugar 4oz/120g Butter 2 eggs 2 teaspoons Mixed spice 4oz/120g Glace cherries



Tustructions

Beat the eggs and chop the cherries.

Sift the flour into a large mixing bowl.

Add the eggs, sugar, butter, mixed spice and cherries.

Mix to a firm batter.

Grease a bun tin.

Drop a good spoonful of the batter into each of the bun tin compartments.

Bake for 20 minutes at gas mark 4 or 160c.

Leave to cool and sprinkle some sugar on the top to finish.

This recipe should make 18 cakes. If your tin only has 12 slots then bake in two batches. 22





My dear Friends,

I have been impressed and thrilled by the tremendous effort that has gone into providing street parties for our children, that they may thoroughly enjoy the Jubilee celebrations. Well done! I am sure our children had a really lovely and memorable time.

Of course, we want the best for our children. We take trouble and spend time and money to give our children what we consider is good for them. Certainly at St. Paul's we very much share this conviction. We have deliberately committed ourselves to do our best to help parents. We now have our own Playgroup run by churchmembers. We support and encourage the Mothers' and Babies Club that uses our premises. We have introduced Family Worship to enable families to come to church together on a Sunday morning. Our worship is designed to help children enjoy and learn in our services, and also for parents, who previously had lost contact with the church, to come and immediately feel at home. Meeting Point on Tuesday afternoons enables nothers to bring their children, knowing they will be ared for as they think about issues that involve their amilies.

Porhaps the highpoint of our effort for many is our nnual <u>Holiday Club</u>. In spite of a change of clergy and he losing of the original leader, we have prepared with mainly local leadership to produce the week as usual aug. 1-6). We hope that you will allow your children to come.

Because of our concern that children should have the best, we long that they should have a <u>Christian Upbringing</u>. revious generations in this country have automatically been viewed as Christians, and have come to church for Baptism (or Christening) for their children. Today many parents find themselves uncertain of what they believe, and are unsure of what they want for their children. We warmly welcome families for <u>Baptism</u>, but also take care to teach parents and godparents what this means for them. They make solemn and serious promises before God to bring up their children as Christians in the life of the church. Any parents today make these promises, so that their thildren will not be denied the church's blessing, but have little knowledge of what they are saying, and little intention to fulfil these promises. We are conscious that we may be causing many honest people to act dishonestly before God, for the sake of their children. Many parents feel that there ought to be another service that gives thanks for the lovely gift of a child, and asks God's blessing upon their little one, without themselves having to make such promises. We, of course, will baptise children if parents are sure that this is what they want. However we now have an alternative service of Thanksgiving and Blessing for them. This may mean the beginning of a sincere and honest re-examination of the faith, that will lead to firm belief, and the reality of genuine commitment.


