


Our resident theological thinker answers your questions.

This week's Questions is: Who would Jesus vote for?

Boris Johnson, in an interview in 2008 when running for Mayor of London, rather foolishly started a biblical quotation that he wasn't able to finish. He had already been challenged on his attitude to Islam. He was at least honest for once about his lack of adherence, when he said: "I suppose my own faith is a bit like trying to get Virgin Radio when you're driving through the Chilterns; it sort of comes and goes." So would Jesus have voted for our current government? Or any of our politicians?

A message from our friend

Jonathan Veira

Greetings to you all. It is many months since I have written to you, it has been difficult to know what to write in these strange times that we find ourselves in. May God be with us all as we cautiously start to emerge from lockdown – so strange isn't it, things that were 'normal' just a few months ago we hesitate to do.



Of course, lockdown meant all concerts were cancelled. At first, we thought that maybe lockdown would not last long, surely everything would be sorted by June at the latest? We had no clue did we? At present it seems quite possible with the current news that there will be no more concerts this year. So, no income, no prospective income no activity, stay in, what now Lord? What's the plan?

The prospect of so long without doing anything for Jonathan was not going to do him any good at all so. So, Sue came up with the idea of putting something out on Facebook starting with a few songs. These were very well received. They loved the idea of doing a concert but how?! They thought putting something out on a Sunday night via Facebook for anyone at a loose end with an hour to spare would be good - and so Sunday Evenings from the Steinway Room with Jonathan was born. The Steinway Room is in fact their rather small study in Guildford which is dominated by their Steinway grand piano and Sunday evenings are now going out to an audience of thousands each week all around the world from Australia to Norway, USA to St Vincent and all parts of the UK. The numbers watching each evening continue to rise and Jonathan and Sue have been astonished and overwhelmed by the response to these Sunday evenings which soon became 2-hour slots with him interviewing all sorts of people, raising money for various charities and asking for suggestions for song 11 content each week


It was almost as good as having Jonathan and Sue in your lounge, with personal dedications and requests, many of them songs which Jonathan had never sung in public, with only the piano, a mouth organ, maybe even his banjo to accompany him. Sue also joined him and sang with him sometimes and exchanged banter with Jonathan and the audience and more and more people listened as people 'shared' on Facebook. 8pm on Sunday Evenings for thousands was a date they wanted to keep. From the start, people responded to each song, chatting to each other at the same time via Facebook. When someone mentioned that they were ill with Corona Virus, people suddenly offered prayer and comforting words. The next week, everyone wanted to know how Rob was, and so the 'JV Community' was born. God really has turned potential disaster into a fantastic opportunity for Jonathan to reach a bigger audience across the UK and globally than he would have ever believed in the space of 18 weeks.

Of course, through all of this, Jonathan's health continues to give cause for concern. You will be aware from the last prayer letter that Jonathan's kidneys have been failing for about 18 months. At the beginning of the year a kidney transplant was planned for the summer months with every hope that Jonathan would be able to return to concerts in the autumn but then the pandemic happened and all operations were cancelled, as no doubt some of you experienced. Jonathan's latest blood test showed a further deterioration and fortunately Sue is both able and willing to donate one of her kidneys and it is a match for Jonathan. Both of them will undergo operations when Jonathan will have one of Sue's kidneys and the transplant is now planned for October/November. Sue has undergone numerous tests to ensure that her kidney is suitable and that she is healthy enough to do this. Jonathan must have an angiogram at the beginning of October to ensure that his heart/arteries are healthy enough to withstand the operation. Providing this does not highlight any problems everything should go ahead - Covid permitting. Having the operation at this time when concerts cannot take place anyway is the best possible time and gives them both a good recovery opportunity also. We feel that God has had His hand in this plan once again.





God and the Pandemic by Tom Wright

What are we supposed to think about the coronavirus crisis? Some people think they know: 'This is a sign of the End,' they say. 'It's all predicted in the book of Revelation.' Others disagree but are equally clear: 'This is a call to repent. God is judging the world' Tom Wright examines these reactions to the virus and finds them wanting. Instead, he invites you to consider a different way of seeing and responding – a way that draws on the teachings and examples of scripture, and above all on the way of living, thinking and praying revealed to us by Jesus.

Gentle and Lowly by Dane Ortlund

Christians know that God loves them, but can easily feel that he is perpetually disappointed and frustrated, maybe even close to giving up on them. On His Blindness by John Milton

WHEN I consider how my light is spent
E're half my days, in this dark world and wide,
And that one Talent which is death to hide,
Lodg'd with me useless, though my Soul more bent
To serve therewith my Maker, and present
My true account, least he returning chide,
Doth God exact day-labour, light deny'd,
I fondly ask; But patience to prevent
That murmur, soon replies, God doth not need
Either man's work or his own gifts, who best
Bear his milde yoak, they serve him best, his State
Is Kingly. Thousands at his bidding speed
And post o're Land and Ocean without rest:
They also serve who only stand and waite.

Milton was deeply religious and lost his sight when he was in his forties. This was probably to do with his job. He worked for the government and did a lot of reading and writing well into the dark nights. The poem is written in the form of an Italian sonnet: fourteen lines. The first eight are called an octet and the next six are a sestet. Milton's sonnet is autobiographical. He begins with telling us that he has deeply considered his state of blindness. God gave him one talent which he feels is now useless. He wants to continue serving God in a meaningful way, but this ability is now denied him. He finally comes to realise that we can serve God in a number of ways. Those who 'best bear his milde yoak, they serve him best'. We can serve God with patience, humility and peace. We don't have to be active in a hardworking, physical way. To be calm, silent, obedient and loving are very important qualities to God.




